# A GREEN HEART TO THE ESTATE

## the proposals

A large green space will be created in the centre of the estate by rerouting New Brent Street and Foster Street, planting trees and perennial flowers, and adding robust benches, lighting and play equipment.

You told us you wanted:

- open green space
- trees
- low maintenance planting
- opportunities for play
- benches
- good lighting
- outdoor gym equipment
- CCTV
- and for it to be maintained.

We've followed your priorities to design the new 'green', creating a place for everyone.

**1** As many trees are retained as possible, and over 60 trees of various types and sizes will be planted, including trees with seasonal colour.



**2** There will be three larger areas of open mown grass for ball games and informal use.



**3** Where the new paths across the estate meet, 'garden nodes' will be created. A place to play, to garden or to sit in the shade of a tree, these will be places for Fosters Estate residents of all ages to enjoy the outdoors.



**4** Wildflower planting around the existing buildings to create a soft boundary. This will improve privacy for ground floor flats.



**5** Small scale play equipment will be added at arrival points and at the garden nodes. Play equipment will appeal to different age groups through: sensory play, natural adventure play and outdoor gym equipment, but will not duplicate facilities at Hendon Park.
