I am writing to express my concern regarding the Edgware policy in the proposed Main Modification to the Barnet Local Plan.

I use the carpark in Edgware to visit various shops in the Broadwalk shopping centre as well as the banks Barclays and Metro. I see that the Broadwalk is always busy, it is never quiet and lots of older people are happily sitting on benches chatting and using the coffee shop in the centre of the broadwalk. I also use the commuters carpark when I use the station to go into Central London once per week. The local area of Colindale is horrendous, nobody I know is happy living there. I fear that Edgware will become even worse than that.

As a resident of Edgware, I understand the plan has been in development since 2020. However, I only recently become aware of its existence and the possible impact of our Edgware community.

Unfortunately, I haven't received any written confirmation from Barnet council regarding this local plan, despite its significance for Edgware's future. Given the potential for significant change to Edgware's character and residents quality of life, I believe wider notification would have been helpful.

I found the volume and complexity of the Local Plan and the related documents overwhelming. The 42 day consultation period seems insufficient for anybody to comprehend the plans details - especially for anyone with work or caring commitments.

However, I am deeply concerned about the impact of the Local Plan on Edgware and its residents, both present and future.

In light of these concerns, I would like to express my support for any representations made by Save Our Edgware and the Edgware Community Association. Please consider their submissions as reflecting my own concerns.
